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BOATING TRADES ASSOCIATION FINAL LEGISLATIVE REPORT 87th Texas Legislature

<u>June 16, 2021</u>

The Regular Session of the 87th Legislature has finally adjourned (*Sine Die*), ending one of the most unusual sessions ever. Starting in January with an essential lock-down because of the pandemic, the session endured the Presidential election aftermath, a restructuring of the House with election of a new Speaker, and Winter Storm Uri. Initially, the Legislature appeared to retrench for a focused, minimal course to primarily address emergency needs and the budget. What evolved was something quite different, and ended with a quorum-busting walkout by House Democrats, with multiple special sessions and vetoes threatened.

Prompting the session's shift from the opening minimalism was an aggressive dive by Republicans into numerous hot-button issues, with an eye on impacting the next election cycle. The shift found Rs enjoying considerable success with numerous ultra-conservative issues, but not all. They ended the session clamoring for more action via an immediate special session. Democrats on the other hand, fatigued with repeated defensive losses, could not get out of the Capitol fast enough. Which they in fact did with the session-ending walkout, procedurally killing several remaining R initiatives.

The stressful legislative action interestingly brought some late session deterioration in the working relationship between the Lt. Governor and the Speaker. That said, each still carried out their roles effectively and definitively, significantly accomplishing their stated agendas.

Despite the session-ending antics and anger, the session managed numerous successes. The initial issues...the pandemic, the Winter Storm, and the budget...brought non-partisan working unity, and were significantly addressed, as were most of the Governor's emergency issues.

In the midst of everything, the BTAMH and BTAT (collectively "BTA") escaped the unusual session with little problematic legislation. Issues impacting recreational boating and the boating industry fared well. There were no efforts to alter the successes of prior sessions, including the Dealer Manufacturer Agreement Act, the mandatory boater education compromise, documentary fees, the uniform statewide sales tax rate, the sales tax cap, or the VIT. All other proposals of interest to the BTA

were either favorably addressed or did not pass. A tangential victory, again, was the lack of traction on efforts to permit auto manufacturers to establish dealerships.

The BTA continued to present a solid image to the Legislature of statewide cohesiveness and collective concern for issues affecting the recreational boating industry. The ongoing relationship with TPWD was affirmed and strengthened.

The substantive committees on boating matters in both the Senate and House provided the usual diligence and hard work. Senate Natural Resources & Economic Development Committee ("NRC") chairman, Sen. Brian Birdwell (R-Granbury) and Water, Agriculture & Rural Affairs Committee ("WARAC") chairman, Sen. Charles Perry (R-Lubbock), along with House Culture, Recreation & Tourism Committee ("CRT") chairman, Rep. Ken King (R-Canadian), and their staffs, all provided strong leadership on sporting and outdoor recreational issues.

Last but certainly not least, we acknowledge Governor Abbott, Lt. Governor Patrick, and Speaker Phelen for their continued support of recreational boating initiatives. We'll need to remember all of these important officeholders as the next election cycle starts.

Special sessions now loom for multiple topics, including redistricting. The start date for the redistricting session is expected in the fall. The Governor has also indicated he'll be calling a different special session for other unfinished business (likely before the fall). At this point, we don't anticipate that the special session issues will directly impact the boating industry, but attentiveness is necessary.

Overall, during the 87th Regular Session, lawmakers filed 7,327 bills and resolutions, and passed 705, for just under a 10% pass ratio. This is an unusually low output...about ½ the norm, but was anticipated because of the slow start. A pass ratio of approximately 20% (before vetoes) has predominated in recent prior sessions. The Governor has until June 20th to approve or veto bills.

These reports are composed of 2 parts, the subject matter outline below with bills of interest highlighted, and the more comprehensive tracking report (by bill number) which is attached. Bill text can be accessed in either part.

Dealer and Manufacturer Relations

Dealer Manufacturer Agreement Act (Chapter 2352, Occupations Code) ("DMAA")

No legislation materialized directly impacting the DMAA. Ongoing coordination and positive involvement with NMMA, along with staying under the radar with certain legislators, have kept the DMAA stable for now.

We need to stay vigilant on continuing efforts by specific conservative factions to reduce government regulation and involvement deemed detrimental to free enterprise. These groups initially opposed the DMAA, and they continue to look for industry regulatory schemes that can be disrupted.

Electric Vehicle Manufacturers – Tesla & Rivian

The Texas auto industry's ongoing fight with electric car manufacturers attempting to sell direct via the internet or by using manufacturer-owned retail sales venues has again resulted in a victory for the auto dealers. As always, we watch for correlation or precedent with respect to the boating industry.

<u>HB 1865</u> by Briscoe Cain (R-Deer Park)/<u>SB 1400</u> by Bryan Hughes (R-Mineola) -- Relating to encouraging economic development through preferences for residents of this state and certain goods or services manufactured in this state and offered for sale by Texas bidders. This was a new approach by the EV manufacturers.

<u>HB 4379</u> by Cody Harris (R-Palestine) -- Relating to the ownership or operation of a motor vehicle dealership by a manufacturer or distributor of motor vehicles.

Arrow Trucks -- Exemption Continuation

<u>HB 4097</u> by Harold Dutton (D-Houston)/<u>SB 1584</u> by Bryan Hughes (R-Mineola) -- Relating to the ownership, control, or operation of certain used motor vehicle dealers by certain motor vehicle manufacturers and distributors.

Dealer Licensing, Regulation, and Operation

TPWD Licensing & Regulation of Dealers

Dealer licensing and primary regulation are carried out by TPWD, and have been the subject of much debate and negotiation over previous legislative sessions. We continue to coordinate with TPWD on possible initiatives.

TPWD Sunset Legislation

<u>HB 1615</u> by John Cyrier (R-Midland)/<u>SB 700</u> by Dawn Buckingham (R-Lakeland) – Sunset bills can be legislative vehicles for substantive provisions affecting a state agency's jurisdiction and operations, including the industries it regulates. The TPWD sunset bill provides a periodic determination (every 12 years) as to whether TPWD is fulfilling its stated purposes and should continue in existence. Matters impacting the recreational boating industry are fair game in this process. As previously reported, one section in the bill (as filed) oddly addressed boat dealer inspections. This was purportedly added to enhance TPWD risk-assessment protocols. The language has been cleaned-up to more narrowly focus on water safety concerns, if any, at dealerships. The bill also addresses other TPWD functions and

procedures, including complaints, training, park funding, hunting & fishing license fees, and plant conservation. None of these changes appear problematic to the boating industry.

SB passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 9/1

Uniform Certificate of Title for Vessels Act ("UCTVA")

TPWD has suggested that BTAMH and BTAT consider possible enactment by the State of Texas of the UCTVA, which purports to modernize boat titling laws and promote multi-state titling compatibility (as more states adopt it). This has been discussed by the BTA Legislative Committee and remains under consideration. No related legislation materialized during the session.

Boat Motor Titling

During the interim, a working dealer committee on behalf of BTAMH and BTAT developed a new proposal for TPWD titling of loose engines, which addresses situations where manufacturers do not designate model years. The proposal incorporates use of an 'in-service' year, when no model/program year is specified. It has been accepted by TPWD, and new procedures and electronic titling forms have recently been promulgated. There was no legislative activity impacting TPWD's implementation of the new procedures and forms.

Note, the UCTVA does not provide for separate engine titling, but could be customized to include that.

Pandemic & Disaster Related Legislation

Both BTAMH and BTAT were active in attempting to curb state and local restrictions and limitations on boat dealers as the COVID-19 pandemic emerged in Texas. Ultimately, favorable state interpretations of federal classifications permitted dealers to operate and sell boats during most lock-down periods. Other businesses were not as fortunate. Numerous bills and constitutional resolutions were debated to address the Governor's and local government actions during a pandemic, including authority to mandate business closures. The Winter Strom Uri blackouts and aftermath factored into this debate.

<u>HB 3</u> by Dustin Burrows (R-Lubbock) -- Relating to state and local government responses to a pandemic disaster; creating a criminal offense. This was the primary bill impacting the Governor's powers during a pandemic.

COVID-19 Liability

Tort reform groups are pushing legislation providing a liability shield for business entities from COVID-19 related lawsuits.

<u>HB 3659</u> by Jeff Leach (R-Plano)/<u>SB 6</u> by Kelly Hancock (R-North Richland Hills) -- Relating to liability for certain claims arising during a pandemic or other disaster or emergency.

SB passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 6/14

Business Interruption Insurance

<u>SB 249</u> by Charles Schwertner (R-Georgetown) -- Clarifies that business interruption insurance must cover certain pandemic related losses.

Documentary Fees

There was no legislation impacting current dealer doc fee authorization or OCCC oversight.

Consumer Finance – Debt Cancelation

This topic relates to the financial product made available to boat purchasers two sessions ago. The product provides protection to a purchaser for any gap between insurance proceeds and an outstanding loan amount in the loss or destruction of a boat. The Finance Code permits a boat dealer to charge a fee (which includes a commission to the dealer) for the product. Note, this a financial product, not insurance (although insurance is used by the product vendors).

<u>HB 4277</u> by Ed Thompson (R-Pearland)/<u>SB 1504</u> by Bryan Hughes (R-Mineola) -- Relating to requirements related to refunds and credit provided under terminated debt cancellation agreements. The product vendors did not support this measure.

Water Safety

Mandatory Boater Education

There were no changes to current mandatory boater education requirements.

Life Jackets

Previous legislative efforts to replace the current requirement for persons age 13 and younger to wear PDFs, with a phased roll-out for all persons born after 2003, did not materialize.

<u>HB 1676</u> by Vikki Goodwin (D-Austin)/<u>SB 1297</u> by Judith Zaffirini (D-Laredo) -- Applicable only to certain educational and camp entities (not boating directly), requires that PFDs be provided for children under 18 in certain swimming situations.

HB dead SB dead <u>HB 2499</u> by Lynn Stucky (R-Denton) -- Relating to the wearing of a personal flotation device while being towed behind a motorboat; creating a criminal offense. The bill's primary purpose was to address safety concerns from loss of consciousness due to engine fumes. This was not a TPWD initiative.

BWI

<u>HB 2327</u> by John Frullo (R-Lubbock) -- Relating to increasing the criminal penalty for operating a watercraft while intoxicated with a child passenger; changing the eligibility for deferred adjudication community supervision.

Dead

<u>HB 2505</u> by Reggie Smith (R-Van Alstyne) -- Relating to the operation of a watercraft while intoxicated. This similarly to HB 2327 and HB 3064 addresses the child passenger situation.

Dead

<u>HB 3064</u> by Will Metcalf (R-Conroe) -- Relating to creating the criminal offense of boating while intoxicated with a child passenger; changing the eligibility for deferred adjudication community supervision.

Dead

<u>HB 558</u> by James White (R-Hillister) -- Relating to the taking of blood specimens on arrest for certain intoxication offenses. The bill mandates requirements for taking blood specimens by peace officers in aggravated watercraft accident situations.

Passed Legislature, sent to Governor on 5/31

Taxation

Uniform Boat Sales Tax Rate

The fixed statewide auto sales tax rate of 6.25%, along with the same uniform boat sales tax rate, are always discussion items when the state has budget issues. As pre-session budget concerns were erased by strong overall sales tax revenues, particularly from internet sales, the threat to sales tax modifications never became an issue.

But keep in mind, as property tax reform and school finance continue as central legislative priorities, the review of new revenue streams for both state and local governments will remain a consideration item in the future. Also, support for increased use of sales taxes, with corresponding reductions in property and other taxes, continues to be favored. Sales tax base expansions, as well as rate increases, will always come into the discussion here.

Vigilance is always required for legislative impact on the current fixed boat sales tax rate.

Boat Sales Tax Cap

Just as the uniform rate, discussed above, is impacted by state revenue needs, so are tax preferences. Last session's enactment of the boat sales tax cap falls into this category, and as such, attentiveness is needed. There was no legislation this session affecting the cap.

There has been discussion on possible clean-up to last session's tax cap bill with respect to the use of Temporary Use Permits ("TUPs"), particularly as to application to both boats and engines (including multiple engines). There was also concern on the negativity created by TUPs and the use of Texas waters by vacationing boaters from neighboring states.

There was no legislation affecting TUPs or related procedures this session, so this remains a possibility for action in a future session.

Tax Preferences

<u>HB 1335</u> & <u>HJR 74</u> by Harold Dutton (D-Houston) - Provides for the creation of the 'Select Committee on Periodic Tax Preference Review' empowered to conduct 6-year sunset-type reviews of tax preferences (*i.e.*, exemptions) to establish systematic expirations of unnecessary tax preferences. This could include the boat sales tax cap.

Sales Tax - Additional Retailer Reimbursement for Credit Card Use

<u>HB 1389</u> by Ryan Guillen (D-Rio Grande City)/<u>SB 1513</u> by Judith Zaffirini (D-Laredo) -- Relating to certain reimbursements and discounts allowed for the collection and payment of sales and use taxes.

Franchise Tax

Modifying the franchise tax remains a priority issue for the legislative leadership. Several bills were filed to amend or eliminate the tax. Nothing moved this session.

Paycheck Protection Program

<u>HB 1195</u> by Charlie Geren (R-Fort Worth)/ <u>SB 372</u> by Kelly Hancock (R-North Richland Hills) – Ensures that total revenue for franchise tax purposes does not include any forgiven PPP amount. Also provides that PPP 'qualifying expenses' are includable in COGS or compensation calculations.

HB passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 5/8

Property Tax/Vessel Inventory Tax (VIT)

As discussed above, property tax reform and cuts remain a central legislative priority, which could have impact on the VIT. There was no change to the VIT this session.

Business Inventory Tax Repeal

<u>HB 1395</u> by Mayes Middleton (R-Wallisville) – Purports to repeal all business inventory taxes. In that regard, the bill also repeals the VIT, but confusing drafting appears to leave boat dealer inventories subject to property taxation, which was not the intent.

Boats – Tax Situs

<u>HB 4495</u> by Jim Murphy (R-Houston) -- Relating to the allocation for ad valorem tax purposes of the value of vessels and other watercraft used outside this state.

Boat Ownership and Use

Boat Titling Exemption – Antique Motors

HB 2450 by Cody Vasut (R-Angleton) – Exempts antique outboard motors (40 years or older).

Boat Trailer Registration - TPWD & DMV

TPWD has expressed interest in obtaining joint authority with DMV in the registration and titling of boat trailers. There was no legislation addressing such an effort between the two agencies.

Boat Trailer Registration - Available County Offices

<u>HB 3113</u> by Ed Thompson (R-Pearland)/<u>SB 876</u> by Kelly Hancock (R-North Richland Hills) -- Relating to the county in which a motor vehicle dealer may apply for the registration of and title for certain vehicles sold by the dealer. Expands county offices available for use.

SB passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 3/1/2022

<u>HB 3664</u> by Jay Dean (R-Longview) -- Relating to designation by the purchaser of a motor vehicle of the county in which a motor vehicle dealer shall apply for the registration of and title for certain vehicles sold by the dealer; authorizing a civil penalty.

Trailers - Disaster Relief

<u>HB 1367</u> by Celia Israel (D-Austin) -- Provides an exemption from registration for trailers sold to certain organizations providing disaster relief.

M&M Liens

The effort to reform and update Texas mechanic's and materialmen's laws has been attempted for many sessions.

<u>HB 2237</u> by Dustin Burrows (R-Lubbock) -- Relating to mechanic's, contractor's, or materialman's liens. This massive overhaul of the M&M statute purportedly has agreement from all stakeholders.

Passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 1/1/2022

Hunting & Fishing Licenses

HB 1728 by John Smithee (R-Amarillo) -- Provides for short-term license exemptions for certain veterans.

Passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 9/1

<u>SB 1223</u> by Drew Springer (R-Muenster) -- Relating to fee waivers for certain hunting and fishing licenses for certain volunteer firefighters.

Abandoned or Unlawful Fishing Devices

<u>SB 599</u> by Charles Perry (R-Lubbock)/<u>HB 2724</u> by Matt Krause (R-Fort Worth) -- Details authority for TPWD to seize and dispose of abandoned or unlawful 'fishing devices'. This is a TPWD generated bill.

SB passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 9/1

Fishing – Bag and Length Limits

HB 2412 by Jay Dean (R-Longview) -- Relating to bag and length limits for certain fish.

Dead

Guns on Boats

There were numerous bills impacting the carrying, holstering, and transporting of firearms, which affect the presence and legality of handguns on recreational boats. The bills below contain specific references to watercraft.

<u>HB 1927</u> by Matt Schaefer (R-Tyler) – Relating to carrying a firearm by a person 21 years of age or older and not otherwise prohibited by state or federal law from possessing the firearm, and to other

provisions related to the carrying, possessing, transporting, or storing a firearm or weapon; and creating criminal offenses. This is the 'permitless carry' bill (aka, the Firearm Carry Act of 2021). The bill provides statutory exceptions to current handgun prohibitions, which significantly expand general authority to carry handguns without a CHL if the carrier is 21 or older. The bill preserves current exceptions for (*i.e.*, allows) watercraft owners or persons in control of a watercraft to possess handguns inside or in route to the watercraft. It also provides exceptions for: 1) watercraft owners or persons in control of a watercraft owners or persons in control of a watercraft, if 21 or older, to carry holstered handguns "in plain view" on the watercraft (CHL holders can already do this); 2) intoxicated handgun carriers, if inside or in route to a watercraft that they own or control or have the consent of the watercraft owner or operator; and 3) handgun carriers otherwise prohibited from possessing firearms by Chapter 46.04 (a), (b), or (c) of the Penal Code (for example, felons), if inside or in route to a watercraft they own or control.

Passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective on 9/1

<u>HB 2112</u> by Will Metcalf (R-Conroe) & <u>SB 550</u> by Drew Springer (R-Muenster) – Relating to carrying holstered handguns by CHL holders. Removes holster type qualifications (*i.e.*, shoulder or belt) from watercraft owners or persons in control of a watercraft, who have CHLs, to carry holstered handguns "in plain view" on the watercraft. These bills will need to be harmonized with HB 1927 above.

HB 2112 passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 9/1 SB 550 passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 9/1

<u>HB 2967</u> by Jeff Cason (R-Bedford) -- Relating to the unlawful carrying of a handgun in a motor vehicle or watercraft. This bill extended carry prohibitions in connection with gang-related convictions.

Flooding & Drought

Lake Houston Watershed

SJRA and City of Houston regulations impacting Lake Conroe lake levels and Lake Houston flows continue to be a subject of contention, including the recent filing of an injunction action by a Lake Conroe property owner group in connection with the 'Seasonal Lake Lowering Program'. There are several bills filed in the Legislature impacting the selection of SJRA directors and SJRA financial operation, and Lake Houston dredging matters. None of these bills passed.

The SJRA was also up for sunset review this session, but that review has been postponed until next session.

Gulf Coast Protection District

<u>SB 1160</u> by Larry Taylor (R-Friendswood)/<u>HB 3029</u> by Dennis Paul (R- Houston) -- Relating to the creation of the Gulf Coast Protection District; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose fees; providing authority to impose a tax; and granting the power of eminent domain. This measure is needed in connection with federal funding and participation. It creates a 5-county master entity (Sabine Pass to Galveston) to undertake, in conjunction with USACE, the design and construction of major seawall protection improvements, including coastal barriers and storm-surge gates. The bill does not specify any particular project. It's governed by an 11-member board of directors appointed by the Governor and the 5 participating counties.

SB passed Legislature, signed by Governor, effective 6/16

Water & Air Pollution

There were no problematic mandates regarding boat or motor fuel usage and discharge.

Zebra Mussel Control

TPWD is satisfied with its current statutory and regulatory tools, and is not seeking legislation. No bills on this issue were filed.

Habitat Protection -- Seagrass

There was no legislation regarding TPWD efforts to further implement the CUWG report or enhance scientific study area designations or seagrass protections.
